Easier train tickets

The State Railway of Thailand (SRT) has joined hands with Krung Thai Bank (KTB) to allow passengers to pay for their tickets via debit and

credit cards as well as via KTB's e-wallet app.

About 140 electronic data captures (EDCs) will be implemented in 56



major train stations nationwide, including Hua Lamphong. SRT expects this will help passengers and further facilitate a cashless society.

Airport hearing passed

The Satun airport project has passed a second public hearing.

The forum was recently organised by the Department of Airports and attended by representatives of public and private groups as well as local communities. The DoA conducted a feasibility study around the fourth quarter of 2018. It took about a year to be completed. The objective of the project is to boost the economy in the South and to increase tourism.

During the public hearing, a 3,500 rai site in tambon Jebilang in Muang district was chosen. It is located in the northeast of the city, about a 30-minute drive to the city centre.

The location is also about a 45-minute drive from the Pak Bara Pier, where locals and tourists can take ferries or speed boats to Koh Tarutao, Koh Lipe and Koh Adang, famous islands for snorkelling and diving activities in the Deep South. Parts of the southern province are also named the first Unesco Global Geopark in Thailand.

The initial budget for the project is about 3 billion baht. The airport is expected to handle up to 500,000 passengers a year and up to 5 million passengers within the first 20 years of operation.

The project will be submitted to the Transport Ministry, which will forward it to the cabinet for approval next month.

Highway to Rayong

The Department of Highways will open the extension of Highway 7 from Pattaya to Rayong

During the opening period, it will offer the service for free until the official opening in August.

The project is expected to help logistics and tourism. The department invested about 20.2 billion baht for the extension, which is about 32km in distance.

The fee for four-wheel vehicles on the motorway from Bangkok to U-Tapao exit in Rayong will be 130 baht. The exit is close to U-Tapao Rayong Pattaya International Airport and Map Ta Phut Industrial Estate.
